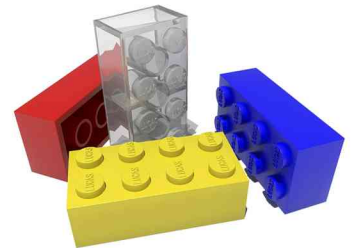


Book Babies

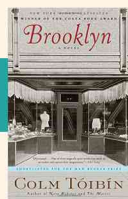

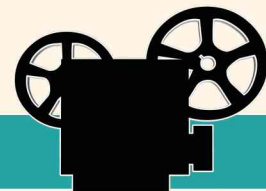

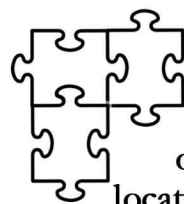
