## General James B. McPherson

The public is invited to celebrate the 185th birthday of General James B. McPherson with the General, as portrayed by Pennsylvanian Scott Thomas, on Thursday, November 14, at 6:30 p.m. here at the library. Birthday cake and punch will be served after his presentation. Scott Thomas, who is related to the General's uncle, was born in Williamsport, Pennsylvania and grew up in Harrisburg. He enlisted in the Air Force in 1974 and retired in 2000. When he settled 10 miles away from Gettysburg in 2003, he started portraying James McPherson. He has studied the Civil War and researched the life of the General extensively. As part of Lincoln's Generals ([lincolngenerals.org](http://lincolngenerals.org)), Thomas has been involved in recreating the character of General McPherson at reenactments throughout the country.

*The Rosie Project* by Graeme Simsion



Meet Don Tillman, a brilliant yet socially challenged professor of genetics, who's decided it's time he found a wife. And so, in the orderly, evidence-based manner with which Don approaches all things, he designs the Wife Project to find his perfect partner: a sixteen-page, scientifically valid survey to filter out the drinkers, the smokers, the late arrivers.

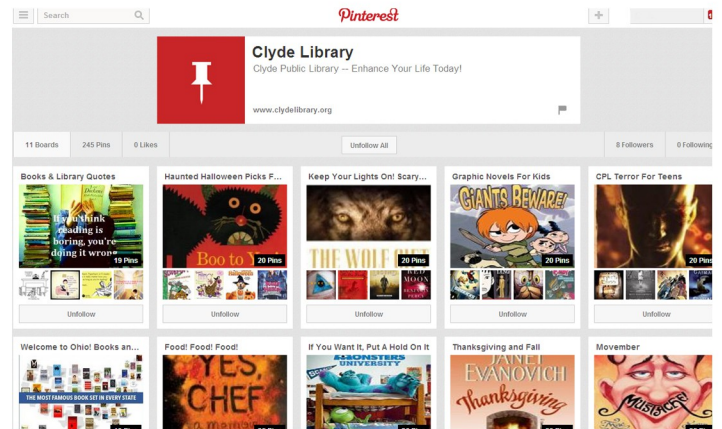
