



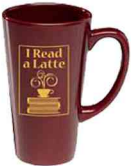

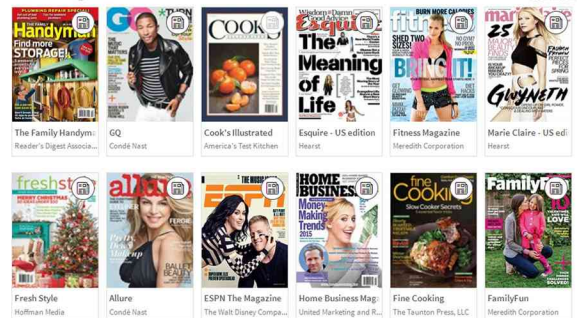

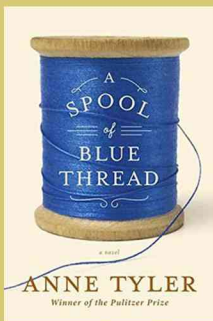

I was holding onto the books until he was ready for them, and something made me open the book "Peter Nimble and His Fantastic Eyes" and start reading. Just like that, the magic of reading was back and I was hooked. Once I finished that book, I read "Skulduggery Pleasant" and was hooked again.

Jonathan Auxier's books are children's books but any age would enjoy them. They are perfect books to read together as a family. Derek Landy's "Skulduggery Pleasant" series is a paranormal young adult series about a detective who is a skeleton. Both Auxier's and Landy's books will make you laugh out loud, keep you on the edge of your seat, make you fall in love with all the characters and their world, and maybe even shed a tear or two.

Now I am back to reading four books at the same time, and my to-read list just keeps growing and growing with no sign of stopping. I highly recommend authors Auxier and Landy to anybody who wants to experience the magic of reading.
