Using hoopla, you can now download movies, music, ebooks, audiobooks and comics to your mobile device, in addition to streaming! (NOTE: cannot be downloaded to your laptop/computer)

Checkout times for items are: movies – 3 days, music – 7 days, ebooks-audiobooks-comics – 21 days

You don't have to wait for an item, it's available now! Plus, there are no overdue fines since titles are automatically returned at the end of the loan period.

Ten items may be borrowed per month. Your account is reset on the first of each calendar month.

Be sure and get the **FREE hoopla** app for your mobile device (Android or IOS) at the APP store. From your computer/laptop, using your internet browser, go to our website clydelibrary.org and click on the Download It tab, then on Hoopla streaming movies & music.

You will arrive at the **hoopla** site and then will be able to **Log In** if you already have an account, or to create an account click on Sign Up Now and follow the instructions.

If you would like help in getting started with hoopla, feel free to stop by the Library during our Tech Time Drop In from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. every Friday for one-on-one instruction.



Hidden Gems: Children's Picture Books (GE) The Kee

The Keeping Quilt by Patricia Polacco Grades K-3

A rich immigrant's tale, this book is the classic American story. A quilt that is made from the bits and pieces of the past to warm up the present, it provides not just the story, but the only color in these otherwise black and white ink drawings.

The Little House by Virginia Lee Burton Grades 1–4

Before arriving at the happy ending, readers will experience the growth of a city as it surrounds the previously isolated little house. Burton's fanciful drawings add to the delight of the story.

Owl Moon by Jane Yolen Grades 1–5

A classic example of child's mind expanding a simple walk into a glorious adventure. As a girl and her father hike through the moonlit night, the creatures they encounter become thrilling companions for their owl hunt.

Skippy Jon Jones by Judy Schachner Grades 1–4

A wonderful combo of story, rhyme, Spanish-English hybrid, color, action and pure joy, this book has something to enchant any kid and is a fantastic read aloud. SkippyJon is part kitten, part dynamo. A real fiesta (muy caliente)!

Sylvester and the Magic Pebble by William Steig Grades K–5

Once a pebble-collecting donkey finds his lucky stone, misadventure begins. Once Sylvester accidentally turns himself into a stone, it seems all is lost, but eventually he comes back to his donkey self — and wishing is approached more carefully!
