"Factory Man: How One Furniture Maker Battled Offshoring, Stayed Local – And Helped Save an American Town" ~ by Beth Macy

Mosaic Photobook App (Android & IOS)

photobook is a mosaic personalized gift for friends and family, or for you. It features 20 pictures (one photo per page) from your Android phone, iPhone or tablet using Facebook, or other photo albums. The book cover comes in black or white and is 7 inches by 7 inches so it's light and easy to carry with you to show off to people. Inside the cover is a collage page of 13 of the 20 photos. The photobook and packaging are of high quality, so you can give it as a gift. I made one for my mother for Mother's Day and one for my brother for Father's Day, and they both loved them. They enjoyed reliving special moments in their lives by looking at the pictures.

The cost is \$20 plus \$5 for shipping (always 4 days). Your order status is constantly updated on your app. My only gripe is that you cannot preview/crop the picture or add text before choosing it within the Mosaic app. I'm sure that you could edit/add text to your photos before you upload them to Mosaic. You can download the app for free from heymosaic.com or by searching "mosaic photobook" in the app stores.
